### The Wisdom of Rev. Maclean

I am not a Presbyterian, but some of my friends consider me an honorary Presbyterian of sorts because my favorite film is Robert Redford's 1992 masterpiece, *A River Runs Through It.* The film is based on the memoirs of Norman Maclean, the eldest son of a staunch Scottish Presbyterian minister in the scenic Montana of the 1910s and 1920s. The young Norman struggles to relate to his reserved and rational father, and he is often overshadowed by his wild and charming younger brother Paul, played by a 29-year-old Brad Pitt. Still, the Maclean brothers grow up in a loving home where their father teaches them the arts of elegant and succinct writing ("Half as long," the Rev. Maclean repeatedly advises Norman on his essays) and, most importantly, fly fishing.

My late twentieth-century Baptist family was, in many ways, quite different from the Macleans' early twentieth-century Presbyterian one. Sadly, I grew up lure fishing rather than fly fishing, and I haven't been in nearly as many boxing matches or speakeasies as the Maclean boys. But as an eldest child who loved to write, but often had trouble saying the most difficult or vulnerable things out loud, I learned early on to look at this film as a sort of roadmap. Certainly it influenced my impractical decision to be an English major in college, which is how I met my wife Julie.

With apologies for the spoilers, the key moment in *A River Runs Through It* comes after the two brothers' paths in life diverge, and Paul, the younger brother, is killed over a gambling debt. The Rev. Maclean is not an emotionally expressive man, and he never reflects directly on his family's great loss. Instead, he speaks of it obliquely in one of his stark, beautiful, understated Presbyterian sermons:

Each one of us here today will at one time in our lives look upon a loved one who is in need and ask the same question: We are willing help, Lord, but what, if anything, is needed? For it is true, we can seldom help those closest to us. Either we don't know what part of ourselves to give or, more often than not, the part we have to give is not wanted. And so it is those we live with and should know who elude us. But we can still love them - we can love completely without complete understanding.

This lesson has served me well over the past decade as God has led me to places this small-town Midwestern boy never could have expected, to situations for which I could never have prepared, among people very different from any I met in my first two decades of life. I have worked in factories alongside former bikers, and I've sat across a conference table from leading New Testament scholars. I have studied alongside drag queens and self-described pagans, and I've had Shabbat dinner with devout Israeli Jews in the Galilee. And still I'm learning how to love the people closest to me, how little I really know of them, how often I can be surprised. The Rev. Maclean simply keeps reminding me that complete love—whether of old friends or new, people who are like me or people very unlike me, Baptists, bikers, scholars, Episcopalians, construction workers, pagans, and now even Presbyterians—does not require complete understanding. I am honored to continue learning this lesson alongside the people of Westminster.

# CCA Thanksgiving Bags 2021 Collection Day Sunday, October 24

Each November, Christian Community Assistance provides a Thanksgiving food bag and a \$10 gift card to help families in need have a traditional Thanksgiving meal. Due to Covid and facility concerns, collection and distribution are a bit different this year. CCA will be receiving donated bags all through the months of October and November. Distribution of the bags will be done from the CCA facility beginning November 1 and continue until the supply is gone. Every client family will receive a bag and gift card in addition to normal food donation.

While monetary funds are always appreciated, CCA will not be able to build Thanksgiving bags with donated funds. For this Thanksgiving program, CCA needs complete bags plus the \$10 to purchase the gift card. The gift card helps families purchase meat or other items to complete the meal.

Giving for the gift card can be done on the Church Center app or by check. Make checks out to Westminster, label "Thanksgiving" on the memo line and drop the check in the offering plate. Please do not put checks in the bags.

Westminster's bag collection and blessing day is **Sunday, October 24**. We encourage you to bring bags to the church that day, but they can also be dropped off at the church during office hours any time in October or November. If you are unable to bring a bag to church, contact Susan Green to arrange a pickup.

Food assistance need is greater than ever. Westminster traditionally averages a collection of about 45 bags of the 300 needed. Our goal this year is to provide 60 or more bags. As always, CCA greatly appreciates the continuing support of Westminster.

# Presbyterian Night Shelter

Every year, Outreach & Mission designates part of our budget to organizations we believe are making a difference to those in need in our community. We'll highlight these throughout the year so you can better know their mission and why we support them. One is Presbyterian Night Shelter.

Since 1984, Presbyterian Night Shelter (PNS) has worked to eliminate the cycle of homelessness in Tarrant County. PNS was started by a group of Presbyterian churches as an overnight shelter for men, women and children. Today, PNS retains many of the elements that gave the agency its name, providing spiritual guidance to those who seek it.

Here's how PNS – and you – are helping those who need shelter:

- True Worth Place meets immediate physical needs, like safety, food and hygiene. Facilities are designated for single adults, families, veterans and those struggling with behavioral issues.
- The "housing first" philosophy prioritizes case work that removes barriers to permanent housing such as obtaining appropriate documents like Social Security cards. Once stable housing is attained, other challenges can be addressed.
- Through UpSpire, PNS provides gainful employment opportunities to guests who are willing and able to work.
