The above song lyrics come from one of my all-time favorite bands, the Classic Crime. They are an Alternative Rock band based out of Seattle and I have been listening to them since I was in high school. So, you might be wondering why I am sharing song lyrics from a band I listened to in high school. Well, the answer is twofold.

- The first is that I believe music can be a way in which we connect to God and experience the divine. Even if it isn't explicitly Christian in nature doesn't mean that we cannot experience God touching our souls through the lyrics and the rhythm.

Treasurer's Corner April 2021

For the first quarter of 2021 pledged donations have been \$74,687.63, 93% of budget. Open plate donations have been \$12,010.10, 112% of budget. Combined, we are at 97% of budget, about \$3,900 below budgeted donations. The PPP loan the church received last May in the amount of \$43,665 was forgiven in January and converted to a grant. The portion of the grant attributable to the first quarter is \$10,916.25. Total revenue for

quarter was \$97,639.28. Expenses for the quarter were \$92,654.58, resulting in an increase in the operating fund of \$4,984.70.

The mortgage balance is \$162,731,23. With just the required monthly payment, the mortgage should pay off in March 2025. Any monies donated to mortgage fund are paid out monthly as additional principal and will advance the pay off date. I have been gratified and humbled by the faithfulness of this congregation through this very trying time. It was wonderful seeing so many of you on Easter Sunday!

WPC Mission: Presbyterian Children's Homes and Services

Every year, Outreach & Mission designates part of our budget to organizations we believe are making a difference to those in need in our community. We'll highlight these throughout the year so you can better know their mission and why we support them. One is Presbyterian Children's Homes and Services (PCHAS).



PCHAS serves nearly 5,000 children and families across three states – Texas, Louisiana and Missouri – every year. With support from foundations, churches and individuals, the nonprofit has one mission: to provide Christ-centered care and support to children and families in need.

One of the main ways PCHAS serves is to offer a variety of residential- and community-based programs. This includes foster care and adoption, residential services and mentoring and family preservation. The closest group home to Fort Worth is in Itasca, Texas, which some of our members have visited.

Only 25% of PCHAS' costs are covered by the state and federal funding, with the rest coved in part by an endowment – but more than 50% is provided by congregations and individuals, which is why WPC has long been a supporter. Thanks to this support, children within the PCHAS ministry are working to overcome the trauma inflicted on their lives. They are building courage, confidence, calm and the ability to become independent, educated and loving people themselves.
